

## Adopt-a-Family...It's a Holiday Tradition

Once again, the Cameron Station Community will help those less fortunate have a Merry Christmas. Over the past 22 years, Cameron Station residents have adopted hundreds of families from Samuel Tucker Elementary School, who without our help might not have any Christmas celebration. Last year we returned to the traditional Adopt-a-Family format, both the needs of our families and the response from the Cameron broader Station Community was overwhelming.

While this year continues to be a challenge for all of us, it has been extremely difficult for these families. Needs are greater than ever as many who were already living day-to-day have now lost their jobs due to the closing of many businesses; many have had their working hours cut; and some have also

faced health challenges. This year we welcomed many families from Afghanistan and Ukraine, and they need our help as well.

In order to participate in the Adopt-a-Family program, family needs are screened by the social worker and principal at Tucker Elementary. Lists of needs — some as basic as dishes — are compiled by the school, along with clothing sizes, shoe sizes and special wish lists from the children. We then have families that can be "adopted". In previous years, neighborhood streets banded together; families adopted another family; and one condo community adopted four families. Many of our area businesses adopted families as well.

## Restaurant Review: Panjshir - Home-Style Afghan Food

I would like to introduce you to my new favorite restaurant, *Panjshir*! This establishment has everything I look for in a restaurant. It's small, familyowned-and-operated, serves excellent food reasonably priced, and the staff is efficient and friendly. *Panjshir* offers authentic home-style Afghan dishes from Kabul.

The décor is upscale and inviting; the feeling is intimate and cozy. I've dined at *Panjshir* five times in the past two months, and everything I've ordered has been superb. Those dining with me were in agreement as to the flavor and quality of the food.



Start with one of the tasty appetizers (all very sharable). My favorite is the *Bulanee Gandana*, lightly fried turnovers filled with fresh scallions, herbs, minced beef and a seasoned yogurt sauce. Their *Mahsawa* is one of the best soups I've ever consumed and a perfect complement as outdoor temperatures drop. It's a hearty multi-bean soup topped with seasoned yogurt and a dash of mint.

The entrée list is plentiful, including eight vegetarian options. Seasonal changes appear, such as fall dishes made with fresh pumpkin. Whether you order chicken, beef, lamb or vegetables, your meal is prepared with expertise. My favorite, and litmus test for any Afghan restaurant, is the *Aushak*, dumplings filled with scallions in a seasoned yogurt and meat sauce. Delicious! The lamb dishes are quite popular and regularly recommended by the house. Check out this creative concoction - *Seib Chalow*, baked apples, light tomato sauce, Afghan prunes, walnuts and split peas with basmati.

The desserts all receive high marks, including the requisite *Baklava*. I select the *Gosh-E-Feel*, a light elephant ear pastry sprinkled with cardamom and pistachios. The Cardamom tea pairs well.

The overall Panjshir experience is satisfying in every respect. I think you'll be pleased...I can't wait to return!



## Winter Family Fun on Both Sides of the Potomac

In 2022, the City of Alexandria was named one of the "Top Five Best Small Cities in the US" by Conde Nast Traveler, the world-famous travel magazine; and also one of the "30 Most Magical Christmas Towns Across the World" by Oprah. And it's no surprise, as this area is charming, diverse and full of fun activities for families during winter.

After a very warm summer and fall, the temperatures have finally cooled, and it is time to take stock of all of the winter activities in our area and make some plans. The DMV area is packed full of events in December and January, but we're focusing on two areas: Alexandria and the National Harbor, just across the Potomac in Maryland.

#### Alexandria:

Alexandria was founded in 1749, and the architecture in Old Town, spanning Colonial to Victorian to mid-century modern, is made even more special with Christmas décor added. One of the best times to visit Old Town is during the holidays to take in the many festivities and enjoy the beautiful views.

Old Town Alexandria is home to many dessert shops, including Jeni's Splendid Ice Creams, Pop's Old Fashioned Ice Cream Co., Lavender Moon Cupcakery, Kilwin's, Alexandria Cupcake and many others. Grab your kiddos, get some sweet treats, bundle up and stroll through beautiful Old Town taking in the holiday buzz and excitement.



Pictures with Santa are always a fun experience for parents with young kids. Will your child embrace Santa or will they be terrified? It's a roll of the dice. If you'd like to combine this experience with brunch and cocktails on several dates in December through the morning of Christmas Eve, Alexandria Restaurant Partners' restaurants have a series of **Breakfast with Santa** events at three of their restaurants. Participating restaurants include *Ada's on the River, Mia's Italian Kitchen* and *Theismann's Restaurant*. My family did this in 2021 and will do it again in 2022. It's a very fun and relaxing way to get Santa pics with kids AND have cocktails in the morning!

Finally, on New Year's Eve you can experience the New Year's Eve festival called "First Night Alexandria." Here you can ring in the new year with music, comedy and dance and then end the night with a fireworks show over the Potomac River at midnight. The festival lasts all day, so even if you can't stay awake until midnight, there is plenty to take in earlier.

#### **National Harbor:**

Hop on the water taxi at the Old Town marina for a 20-minute ride across the Potomac and head over to the National Harbor area for "Holidays at the Harbor." Throughout the month of December there are many free events, including a nightly tree lighting from sunset to 9pm, with a light show, fireworks and holiday music from the US Air Force Band.

The Gaylord National Resort & Convention Center also offers several activities for families as a part of their "Christmas at Gaylord National" programming. Their signature event is called "ICE!" and it's back for 2022. This year, the ice sculptures feature scenes from the 1983 holiday classic "A Christmas Story." Using more than two million pounds of ice, the sculptures go up to more than 20 feet in height and include lights and sounds. The immersive experience takes about 30 minutes to walk through, and it's a chilly 9° Fahrenheit inside! Kids can also glide down a giant slide made of ice; go snow tubing; have snowball fights at the Gaylord National on Snow Flow Mountain (made from snowmaking machines); go ice skating; or just zoom around. There is also an area for photos with Santa and gingerbread house-making.


At the MGM National Harbor resort, there is a Cirque du Soleil-style Christmas show called **Cirque Dreams Holidaze**. On January 6 the dancers and competitors from ABC's Dancing with the Stars come to the MGM Resort with their live tour. And finally, consider a visit to **Top Golf D.C. National Harbor**, in Oxon

Old data is currently being purged, and the transition to the new system will take place over the next few months. The process will require all residents of Cameron Station to obtain a new card/fob or, if you choose, you may obtain mobile credentials on an iPhone or Android phone to enter the building and use the shuttle bus.

In addition, nine (9) security cameras will be installed in and around the Cameron Club. Contractors will be working during the next few months to add necessary equipment and transition to the access system.

To provide for a smooth transition, additional information will be circulated about the access system, including a registration form to change from the current paper IDs, access cards, and fobs to the new options for accessing the Cameron Club and shuttle bus. Please hold all questions until such information has been provided.
